What is AAC?

AAC (Augmentative and Alternative Communication) is any way of communicating without speech.

It's used by people who have little or no spoken language, or who need extra support to express themselves.

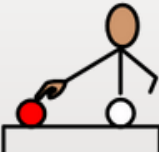
This resource introduces modelling — a simple way to support AAC by speaking out loud while pointing to key words. Don't worry about grammar or getting it perfect. Just show how AAC can be used in everyday play.

Key Points

- Model language without expecting your child to copy - one, two or three words is plenty.
- Use simple, repeated words and phrases.
- Pause to give your child time to process.
- Take turns, even if they don't respond right away.
- Celebrate every attempt to communicate!
